## **When Sufferings Are Blessings**

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A Muslim recovered from a serious illness and said "Alhamdu Lillah, the Merciful Allah has given me full recovery". The atheist friend taunted "if your Allah is Merciful, then why did He give you the illness in the first place?" (The over intelligent Taslima Nasrin has raised the question.)

Now come to think of it, is it an intelligent question? The atheist says, if Allah is Merciful, He should not give His beloved servant any illness. But Allah is not only Merciful, He is All Merciful. He does not discriminate between friend and foe, so He should not give any illness to any individual ever. So, the world should be free of all illnesses. A splendid world it will be, but not the world we know.

Again come to think of a matter, more serious than illness, and should not Allah be Merciful and Just in this respect? Some people die in childhood, some die in the prime of life, and some attain a life of nearly hundred years or even more. According to the atheist's reasoning, everybody born on earth should live the same age, disease free, say a hundred years. To ensure equal longevity to all, all accidents must be eliminated, even minor ones, to eliminate sufferings. A splendid world, but not the one that we know. Have you noticed, a class of people have been eliminated, the doctors. If there is no disease, no accidents, no sufferings, there is not any place for the doctor, or for the hospital. A splendid world, but not the one we know. Besides, when everybody knows when he is going to die, old people meeting each other, instead of greeting "how do you do?" will ask "aren't you going to die tomorrow, or the day after?" What pleasant greetings!

Just as the Merciful Allah cannot cause bodily sufferings, He cannot allow mental sufferings too. You know mental suffering is often more distressing than physical pain. So the Merciful Allah cannot make a girl ugly. To ensure happiness to all, equal happiness, all girls and all young men have to be equally beautiful. The differences of white, black, brown and yellow cannot remain any more, all will have to be the same color, same shade, to make them equally happy. Now, is physical beauty the only means of happiness?

Come to think of a world where every-body is equally beautiful, equally healthy, equally wealthy and equally happy. What a world it will be! But equally wealthy! How can it possibly be? People earn their living by diverse means, and the possibility of earnings is never equal, unless it is regulated. Now, a regulated and regimented human society, can it ever be happy?

Mental happiness is not dependent on bodily charms and health alone. Economic condition of every individual and society plays a major role in determining the physical wellbeing and mental

condition of the individuals. The poor cannot afford the food the rich people eat, and cannot dream of using the luxury items the effluent people use. So to make all people equally happy, the Merciful Allah will have to make everybody equally rich by His command. He cannot leave the matter in the hands of the competitors. You see, some of them may be more efficient than the others, with more ingenious ideas, and some may even be dishonest. Now, can you call it justice, if the more efficient one is cut down to size, for the sake of the less efficient ones? And what about the dishonest ones, will they not be punished? When wealth is distributed equally by divine decree, and all competition is eliminated, how will the agricultural and industrial production keep on boosting? Rather will not all production flop instantly? Most people will think, if I am not going to earn more than the others, why should I exert? Why not go on a vacation?
